

Homework

- **Reading** Children should be heard to read regularly (at least 3 times a week for a minimum of 15 minutes). Parents should write comments in the reading records to update teachers of progress at home.
- **Spelling** A list of words, which the children need to be able to read and spell by the end of the year can be found in their homework book. Children should practise these at their own pace at home.
- Maths/Grammar Children will be set a short piece of Maths or Grammar homework weekly (this will alternate each week). They will bring this home on Friday to be completed by the following Thursday
- Timetables Alongside their homework, children should practise the times tables set on Times Table Rock Stars (at least 30 minutes spread over the week in small chunks of between 5 and 10 minutes)

Year 4 Multiplication Check

- The children will have a statutory online assessment in June
- 25 questions
- There are 6 seconds to answer each question with 3 seconds in between so the children need to know their facts and be able to recall these quickly
- Based on all the times tables up to 12 x 12 but there is more focus on the higher ones


Hear your child read 3 times per week

Discuss the story/content and ask questions about the book to help enhance their comprehension and inference skills.

Use a dictionary to find out the meaning of new words.

Please sign and date the reading diary and highlight anything you think we need to know to support their learning further.

We check the reading diaries on a Friday and award Dojo points when the target number of reads has been achieved.



- Please ensure water bottles are filled with water.
- Snacks should be healthy i.e. plain biscuits or fruit
- Please ensure children are not wearing nail varnish or make up and that hair bands/ribbons are small and discreet
- Ensure everything(!) including coats, water bottles and bags, is named
