## River

The Hungarian Danube traverses 417 km. It forms the border with Slovakia in the north-west and then flows south. Tisza, a major Danube tributary river, a 597 km section traverses across country. The gradients of the major rivers are low, typically 7-8 cm/km for the Danube; 2-5 cm/km for the Tisza.

## Fun Facts

Hungary is also the birthplace of many famous people. Erno Rubik, a sculptor and professor, invented the Rubik's Cube in 1974. Hungary boasts 13 Nobel Prize winners, and magician Harry Houdini was also born in the country's capital, Budapest.

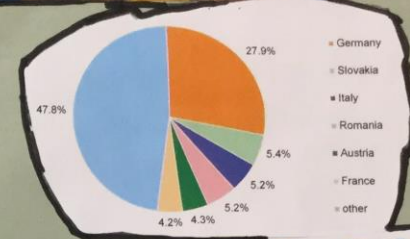
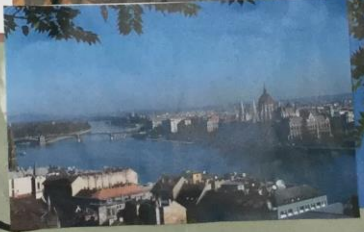


## Industries

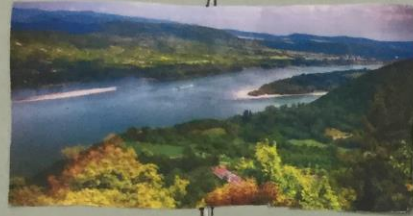

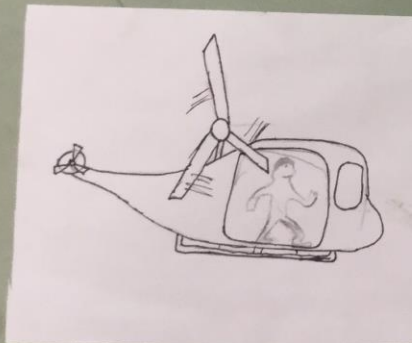

THE TISZA FLOWS THROUGH THE GREAT HUNGARIAN PLAINS AND HUNGARY HAS MANY THERMAL SPRINGS. LAKE HEVIZ NEAR LAKE BALATON IS THE LARGEST THERMAL LAKE IN THE WORLD. THERMAL WATER IS USED EXTENSIVELY FOR SPAS AND PUBLIC BATHS IN HUNGARY. THERE ARE ABOUT 1,500 THERMAL SPRINGS AND OVER 400 PUBLIC BATHS IN THE COUNTRY.

THE SZECSENYI BATHS IN BUDAPEST ARE THE LARGEST SPA BATH COMPLEX IN EUROPE. HORTOBÁGY PUSZTA: THIS IS ONE OF THE EIGHT UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITES OF HUNGARY. THE VAST PLAINS ARE COVERED BY WETLANDS, PASTURES AND GRAZING AREAS OF SHEEP AND CATTLE. THE GRAZING SEASON LASTS FROM APRIL TO OCTOBER. AFTER THIS THE PLAINS ARE DESERTED. LARKS, OWLS, SWALLOWS AND CRANES ARE MOST COMMONLY SEEN BIRDS IN THE WETLANDS. CRANES ARE THE EMBLEM OF THE PARK AND A VISITOR CENTRE INFORMS ABOUT THE 15 DIFFERENT CRANE SPECIES. HUNGARY'S THIRD LARGEST CITY SZEGED.

Hungary's Agriculture

Hungary has a long history of producing plant seeds. Animal production includes 2.7 million pigs and a poultry flock of 40 million birds. The number of cattle of all types are 0.6 million, counted by head. Crops include 100,000 hectares of wheat, 100,000 hectares of corn, 1 million hectares of oilseeds, 1 million hectares of sunflowers and rapeseeds.

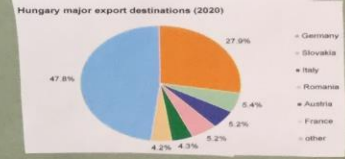

Hungary is also famous for the precious ceramics from Zsolnay and Herend manufactures, paprika spice and handcrafted tablecloths and of course, paprika spice. Hungary even has two museums devoted to the spice - one in Szeged and the other one in Molnar. Wheat, corn, sugar beets, sunflower seeds and potatoes are among the main agricultural products of Hungary.

Services—including banking, education, and tourism—are the main economic activities. Manufacturing is also important. The main industries in Hungary are automotive, electronics, pharmaceuticals, and food and beverage. The country's major mineral resources are lignite, sandstone, and manganese ore.

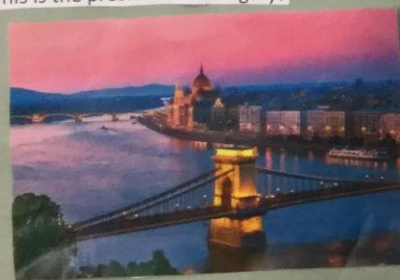

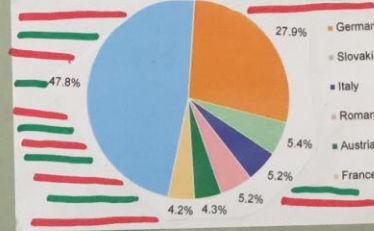
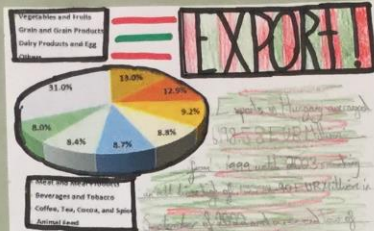
Football is the most popular sport in Hungary. The Hungarian Football Federation is the highest body of professional football in Hungary and was founded in 1901.

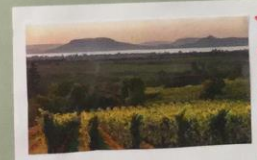

## Agriculture

Hungary's agricultural area spreads over five million hectares, covering almost two-thirds of its territory. The country's large agriculture tradition, excellent geographical conditions, and fertile soil contribute to its success in producing high-quality agricultural goods.
