Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back! We hope you had a lovely Easter break and the children are looking forward to another exciting term! This week have started our new topic 'On the Farm' and after half term we will be learning all about minibeasts with our 'Wriggle and Crawl' topic. Swimming

Our first swimming lesson went really well! We are really proud of enthusiastic, independent and well-behaved the children were. Just a reminder we will be swimming this half term on **Mondays**. Children should have their swimming kit in school on this day in a large shopping bag, big enough to fit their school uniform, shoes and coat into. Earrings must be removed for swimming lessons and please try to avoid tights unless the children can put these on independently. The children will not need their P.E. kit in school whilst we are swimming.

Forest School

We will be continuing with our Forest School sessions on Thursdays. Please remember the children need a change of clothes for Forest School **every Thursday**. As the weather changes the children may not need waterproof clothes but will still need a change of clothes that they do not mind getting dirty e.g. jogging bottoms and an old coat or jacket. Please bear in mind there are nettles at our Forest School site so children need their legs covered.

Ash End Farm trip

Please remember our trip to Ash End Farm is on Tuesday 13th May. Children should wear their school uniform and will need a packed lunch. Payment should be made via School Money by Monday 5th May.

Reading and Phonics

Can we please remind parents that children should be reading at home **5 times every week** as well as practising their Phonics flashcards regularly. They do not need to read the whole book, a few pages is fine. We understand that school days are long for our Reception children therefore reading in the morning can work well, or taking it in turns to read a page each if your child is reluctant to read. Reading regularly is a really important habit for your child to get into as they move towards Year 1 and will be vital in ensuring they are able to keep up as our Phonics programme becomes more challenging next year, therefore please support your child in doing so.

Sun cream

As the weather gets warmer please ensure the children have a sunhat in school and come to school with sun cream already applied. This is much easier and more effective than the children applying it themselves at school as we are not able to assist them with this.
