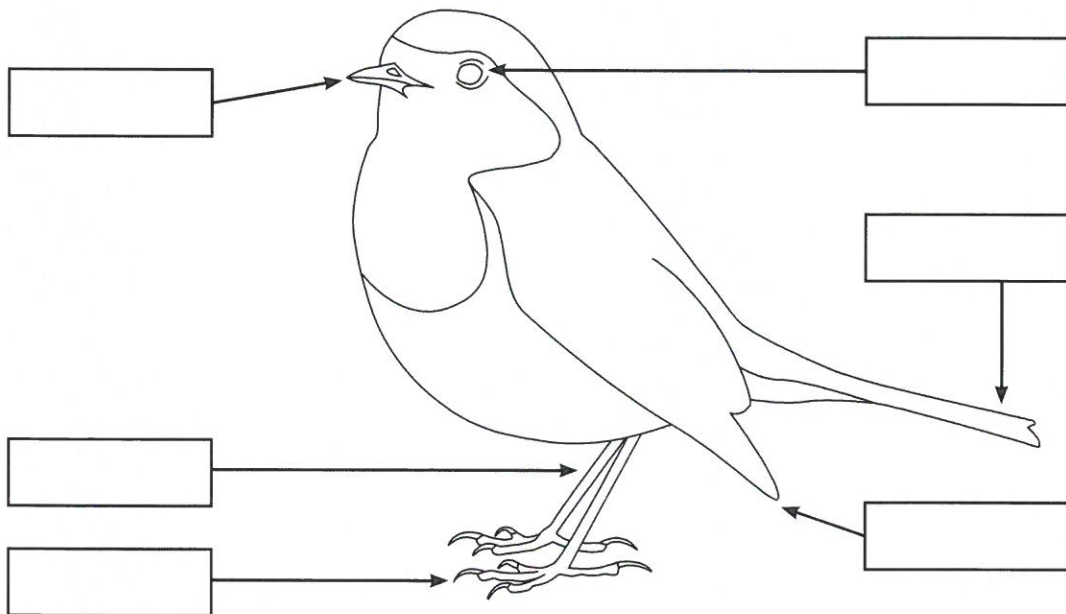

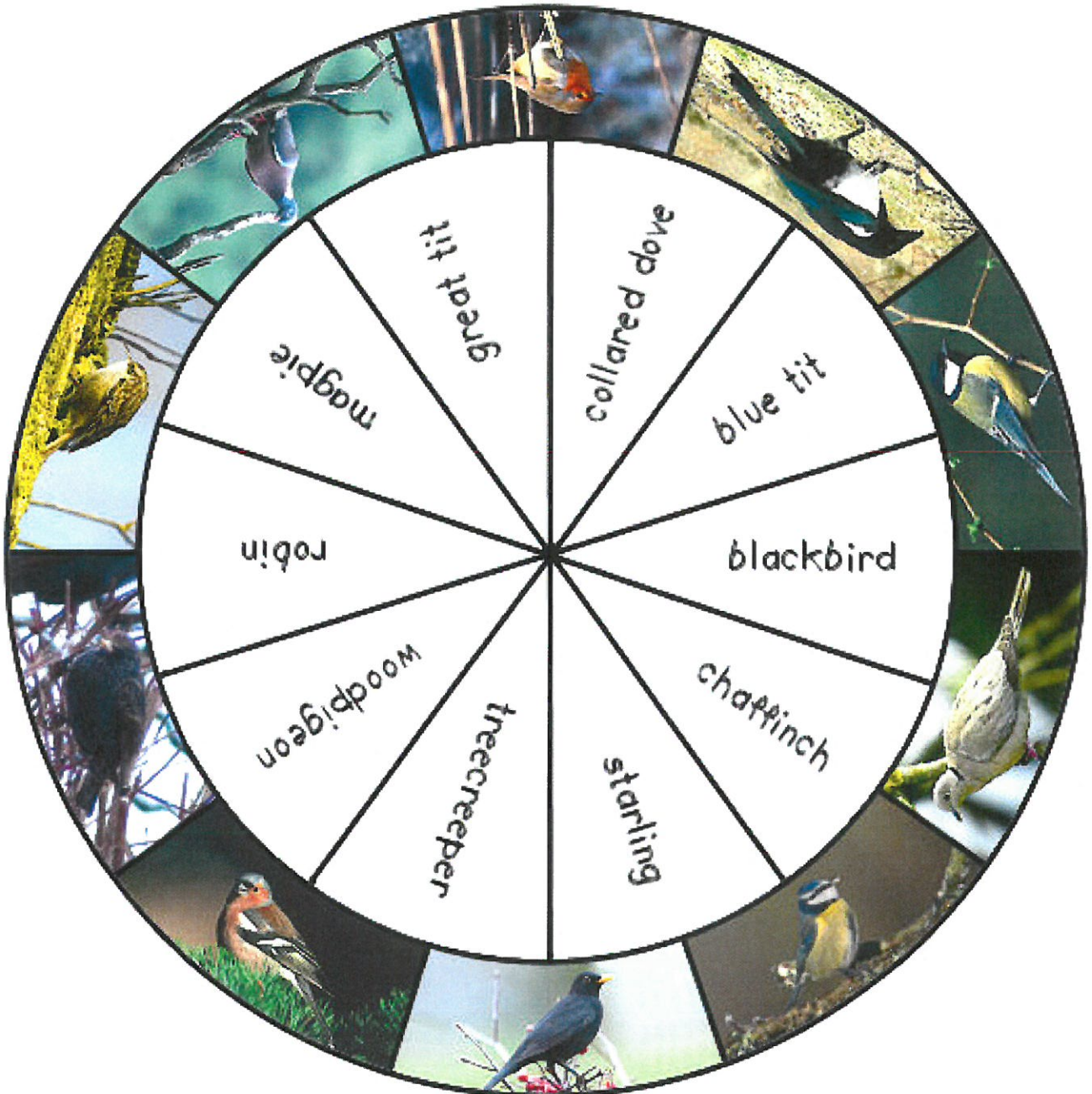

Pine cone lardy seed feeders

Recipe

100 g suet or lard, cut into small pieces and left in a warm place for about an hour.

A handful of sunflower and/or pumpkin seeds or special bird seed.

A handful of raisins*.

Some grated cheese.

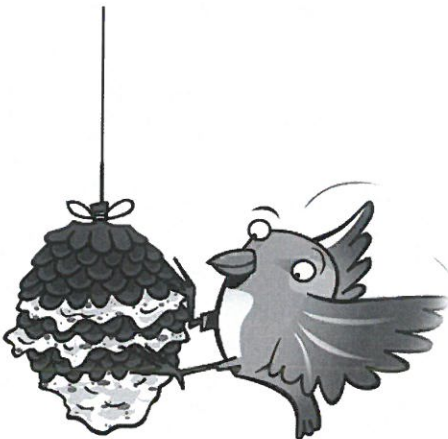
Some unsalted peanuts**.

Place the ingredients in a bowl and squash them together with your hands.

* Raisin warning - don't use if you have dogs.

** Peanut warning - nut allergy, don't put whole peanuts out in breeding season.

1. After making your speedy bird cake mix, stuff some of it in the cracks of your pine cones.
2. Tie a string on to the pine cones to hang them up.
3. Hang the cones from a tree so that you can see them from your window.
