Understanding the World

-provide your child with a range of sea and land creatures. Encourage them to sort them. Can they explain how they have sorted them?
-provide the children with a tablet or laptop - can they make an under the water scene using some paint software.

Physical Development

Watch videos of sea creatures and how they move. Have the children move around mimicking the movements. For example, can they think about how to move their body like an octopus.

Music

Let your child listen to the 'Under the Sea' song from The Little Mermaid. See if they can join in and create a dance.

Design and Technology

-Make junk model sea creatures
-practise scissor control by cutting out sea creature shapes
-talk about animals under the sea blowing bubbles - explore bubble painting
-make some salt dough together and made some sea creatures.

-talk to your child about water safety. How can they stay safe when they are in the water? Can they come up with some rules?
-Talk about different animals that live in the sea. How can we treat them with respect? What can we do to look after them?
