




Easter Story

Make a Easter Sock Rabbit!

Easter Sock Rabbits

You will need:

- A sock
- Rice
- A scoop for the rice
- String or elastic bands
- Ribbon
- Googly eyes
- Glue/adhesive
- Pom-poms
- Scissors
- Markers



Instructions

Step 1

Open up your sock and fold the top around a circular piece of cardboard. (A sticky tape roll could also be used.)



Step 2

Using a scoop, fill the sock with rice from the toe section to the ankle. Be careful not to spill the rice!



Step 3

Use a piece of string or an elastic band and tie the top of the sock. You will need to tie two sections. One for the rabbit's tummy and one for the rabbit's head.



Step 4

Next, use the scissors to cut two rabbit ear shapes into the material above where you have tied the sock with the elastic band/string.



Step 5

Add a nice fluffy tail to the back of the rabbit using a pom-pom. Make sure you use plenty of glue so that it doesn't fall off.



Step 6

Other details can now be added using glue or adhesive. A marker could be used for the rabbit's nose or even whiskers!



Easter Bunny Bread!

Ingredients

Makes: 1 bunny loaf

For the dough

500g plain flour
1 (7g) sachet dried active yeast
250ml lukewarm milk
75g butter, melted
1 egg
3 pinches salt

To decorate

1 egg yolk
sunflower seeds, pumpkin seeds, pine nuts, etc (optional)



Method

Prep:20min › Cook:20min › Extra time:1hr rising › Ready in:1hr40min

1. Place the flour in a mixing bowl and make a well in the middle. Add the yeast with 1/2 the milk and mix well. Cover and let rise for 15 minutes.
2. Add melted butter, remaining milk, egg and salt then knead well to make a smooth dough. Preheat oven to 50 C, or the lowest possible setting. Turn the oven off and place the dough inside, covered. Or, let rise, covered, in a warm location. Let rise for 15 minutes. Knead again and let rise for another 15 minutes.
3. Divide the dough into one large part for the body, 1 small part for the head and 5 very small parts for the head, ears, feet and tail. Shape each part to make a bunny. Brush the contact surfaces with a little water to help them stick. Place on a greased baking tray and let rise for 30 minutes in a warm place.
4. Preheat oven to 180 C / Gas 4.
5. Beat the egg yolk and brush over the bunny. Decorate with seeds if you like. Bake until golden brown, 20 to 25 minutes.

Humpty Dumpty Eggsperiment

HUMPTY'S EGG DROP INSTRUCTIONS

MATERIALS FOR HUMPTY'S EGG DROP EXPERIMENT

- Boiled eggs
- Ziploc bags
- Materials to test – cotton wool, cous cous, rice, bubble wrap.



- Place your material to test in a ziploc bag, add the egg and make sure it's completely covered by the test material.
- Hold the bag at the top as high as you can and drop the bag.
- Check the egg for damage.
- Repeat for each material, if the egg cracks use a new egg for the next test.
- Write up your findings
