HARRIET TUBMAN



Harriet Tubman was born around 1820 in the United States. She was born into enslavement as her mother was already an enslaved person.

Her real name was Araminta Harriet Ross.

She was often whipped and beaten. One a lead weight was thrown at her and hit her on the head.

Harriet had a very hard life working as a field hand in the plantation fields every day in the burning hot sun.

She married a free black man called John Tubman.

Harriet saved over 1500 people during the American Civil War. She became a nurse and a spy. She passed information onto Colonel Sherman and became a hero to many African American people.

After war she returned to Auburn and helped free black people

Saved! Harriet saved more than 1000 people!

Age! Approximately 93 years old

Born! Around 1820

Died! 10th March 1913

Husband! John Tubman

Money! She got money by selling pigs, gingerbread and root beer

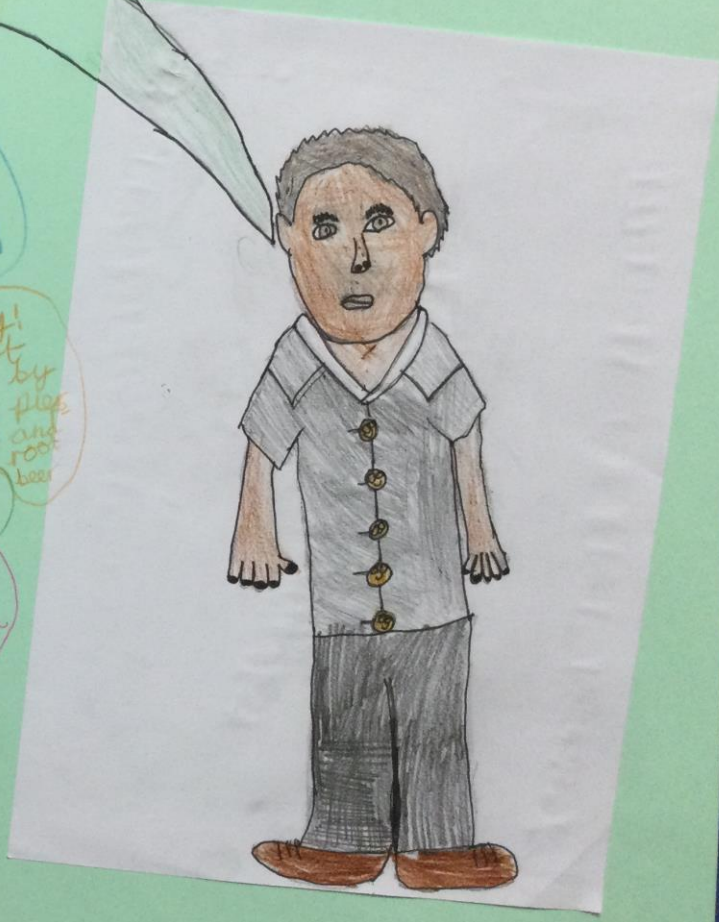
Her last name was Ross until she married John Tubman

Once a lead weight was thrown at her and hit her head. After this she suffered headaches for the rest of her life

Real name! Ariminta Tubman

Escape! She escaped using the secret routes known as the 'underground railroad' and walked nearly 140 KM to Pennsylvania

She died of pneumonia



HARRIET TUBMAN

Harriet Tubman
was born around
1820. She died
on the 10th March, 1913
and she was
approximately 93
years old.

Harriet used a
network of secret
routes known as the
underground railroad
to walk nearly 11000
to Pennsylvania.

However, once they had left her
brothers had second thoughts, so
Harriet made sure they got safely
back to the plantation and she
left again, heading for Pennsylvania,
which was a free state.



In 1844, Araminta married
a free Black man called
John Tubman. It was
around this time that
Araminta changed her
name to Harriet.

Harriet made it her
mission to rescue her
family and friends
from living in enslavement.
Over the following years,
risking her own life, she
returned to Maryland at
night to guide her parents,
siblings and others to safety.

She was a poor woman and
contracted pneumonia. Unable
to pay for medicine, she died in
1913 aged around 93.
