Introduction

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in school-organised events outside normal school hours. We ask children to take pride in their personal appearance. We sell some items of uniform here at school whilst others are easily available, at very competitive prices, at local shops including supermarkets.

Our School Values

At Woodstone we have five school values which underpin all policies, procedures and the day-to-day running of our school for all stakeholders including children, staff, parents and Governors. These are:

- 1. We support each other
- 2. We keep each other informed
- 3. We are proud of our school
- 4. We listen to different opinions
- 5. We try our best

Through the implementation of our school uniform policy, we ensure children are 'living' the value 'we are proud of our school'. We also encourage children and parents to 'try their best' in ensuring children come to school wearing the correct uniform and that this is clean and presentable.

Aims and objectives

Our policy on school uniform is based on the belief that school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in our school
- helps to create a sense of community and belonging towards the school
- identifies the children with the school
- supports our commitment to inclusion
- prevents children from wearing 'fashion clothes' that could be distracting in class
- is practical, smart and designed with health and safety in mind
- is considered good value for money by most parents
- prepares children for the future

Jewellery, Watches, Hair Ornaments, Make-up, Tattoos and Nail Varnish

For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear jewellery. The exceptions to this rule are ear-ring studs in pierced ears, and small objects of religious significance. Children are required to remove any items during PE lessons to prevent them from causing injury. Teachers are not permitted to remove earrings for the children. Wrist watches may be worn but only for the purpose of telling the time. 'Smart' watches linked to mobile phones are not permitted but items such as fit-bits are permitted. Hair bands, ribbons/bows or 'scrunchies' should be plain and either blue or black or white in colour. They should be small and discrete. Large jo-jo bows are not permitted. Hair bands should not have large flowers attached. Make up, tattoos and nail varnish should not be worn to school unless for an out of school hours function, for example a school disco. Extreme hairstyles are not appropriate for school. The use of styling products should be kept to a minimum and children should not have decorative patterns or 'tram lines' cut into their hair or have their hair coloured or dyed. For health and safety reasons and to ensure it does not distract from learning. Long hair must be tied back.

Footwear

For health and safety reasons we do not allow children to wear shoes with platform soles or high heels. All children are required to wear plain black shoes or black trainers without logos as stated in the uniform list. We discourage children from wearing boots as this often prevents them from sitting comfortably on the floor.

The Role of Parents

We believe that one of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that it is clean, in good repair and that the child's name is written on all items. If a parent has difficulties for any reason with fulfilling this request they are asked to speak confidentially to a senior member of staff to discuss the issues. Parents should be assured that we will do all we can to help. Children in receipt of Pupil Premium receive a yearly uniform allowance to help with the cost of purchasing uniform.

Children who arrive at school wearing non-school uniform clothing will be loaned an appropriate item from our lost property box for that day. The same system will apply for children who do not have a PE kit. Parents will be contacted to discuss the matter. The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are serious reasons, for example on religious grounds, why parents want their child to wear clothes that differ from the school uniform, the school will consider such requests sympathetically. If any parent would like to request a modification to the uniform policy they should, in the first instance, contact the headteacher.

The Role of Governors

The governing body supports the headteacher in implementing the school uniform policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity. It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities. Governors ensure that the school uniform policy enables children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hard wearing, safe and practical.

Monitoring and Review

The governing body monitors and reviews the school uniform policy through its Behaviour, Welfare and Safety Committee and will also consider, alongside the headteacher, any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensation with regard to school uniform

School Uniform List

Our school uniform colour is a combination of navy blue and grey/black. Most items can be bought from high street shops/supermarkets. Our uniform can be ordered online so please speak to the office staff for details of prices.

Our school uniform is:

Grey/black skirt/pinafore dress/shorts/trousers (not jogging bottoms) or blue and white checked or striped dress (in summer)

A navy-blue blouse/shirt or polo shirt

Navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan with the Woodstone logo

Plain white/grey/black short or knee length socks (for anyone wearing a skirt or black, navy or grey tights) Please note skirts should be an appropriate length and of a style which allows children to sit comfortably on the floor. When children wear shorts, even when these are worn over tights, they should also be of an appropriate length. Three-quarter, calf length, leggings should not be worn.

Reversible waterproof coats, with the school logo (optional)

Shoes should be flat, black and appropriate for school. If trainers are worn these should be plain without logos. Your child should wear shoes which they can manage to do up independently. Please do not send your child to school in shoes which prevent them from running in the playground.

P.E. Kit

Children need a change of clothes and footwear for P.E (for health and hygiene reasons) and a drawstring bag in which to keep the kit at school. All school uniform and P.E. kit MUST be named.

All children wear:

- navy blue/black shorts
- plain navy-blue t-shirt or polo shirt with school logo
- a pair of plimsolls velcro fastenings are essential for younger children
- navy or black jogging bottoms for outdoor lessons in cold weather
- trainers for outdoor P.E. lessons
