Behaviour, Welfare and Safety Committee Terms of Reference

MEMBERSHIP

- At least 5 governors of whom one must be the Head Teacher
- The governing body will appoint a chair to the committee (this cannot be the Headteacher)
- Non voting members may be co-opted as required
- The governing body will appoint a clerk to the committee (this cannot be the Headteacher)
- Attendees will be invited to attend meetings where appropriate

QUORUM

• 3 governors of whom one must be the Head Teacher

PURPOSE AND MAIN FUNCTION

- To work with the school to promote and ensure the safety, welfare and wellbeing of all staff, pupils and visitors attending the school
- To support the Senior Leadership Team in ensuring they fulfil their statutory duties in relation to health and safety and the safeguarding of children within the school

BEHAVIOUR

- To monitor and promote good behaviour across the school
- To ensure school systems, policies and practises promote appropriate behaviour for learning and that pupils are supported in developing these skills
- To monitor and evaluate the impact of the schools' punctuality, attendance and behaviour policies
- To oversee arrangements for fixed-term and permanent exclusions of pupils
- •To appoint an anti-bullying Governor to oversee the prevention of bullying across the school

WELFARE

• To monitor and evaluate the school's provision for personal development and wellbeing

- To agree annual attendance targets and monitor progress towards achieving these
- To monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of care, guidance and support for learners
- To monitor and evaluate the extent to which pupils contribute to the school and wider community
- To oversee safeguarding within the school
- •To oversee arrangements for educational visits with respect to risk assessments
- To appoint a safeguarding Governor to oversee safeguarding within the school
- To monitor and evaluate the effectiveness of Pupil Premium money in relation to pupil wellbeing

SAFETY

- To advise the Governing Body on priorities, including Health and Safety, for the maintenance and development of the school's premises
- To oversee arrangements for repairs and maintenance of the school site
- To make recommendations to the Finance Committee on premises-related expenditure
- In consultation with the Headteacher and the Finance Committee, to oversee premises-related funding bids
- To oversee arrangements, including Health and Safety, for the use of school premises by outside users, subject to governing body policy
- To oversee arrangements for educational visits, including the appointment of a named coordinator

MONITORING

- •To review policies relating to the committee
- •To carry out a termly Health and Safety review
- To carry out a termly safeguarding review
- •To review the Single Central Record on a termly basis
- To monitor the well-being of children and staff within the school
- To monitor the delivery of the Personal, Social and Health Education curriculum
- To monitor the delivery of the Relationships and Sex Education curriculum
