Science - our sense of touch

Yesterday we learnt how important our sense of touch is, especially for people who have lost their sense of sight. Today we are going to use our sense of touch to explore our gardens. Our skin helps us to feel things, although today we will mainly use our hands. On the next slide there are lots of different 'texture' words - texture means the way something feels. Can you find at least one example of each different texture in the plants in your garden? For example, the bark of a tree might feel smooth but the waxy leaves of a plant might feel smooth. Make sure you do this activity with an adult and wash your hands afterwards. Record your findings into your home learning book.
