Chat Health Text Service: 07520 615382

Chat Health is a confidential text messaging service that enables parents of children aged 0-19 to contact their local public health nursing (health visiting/school nursing) team.



The service operates Monday to Friday between 9am and 5pm, excluding bank holidays.

All texts will be responded to by a public health nurse (school nurse) within 24 hours. Outside of the service working hours, you'll receive a message back to inform you that your text will be responded to once the line reopens.

IMPORTANT CHANGE TO SCHOOL TIMES

From September 2023 it has become statutory for children to be in school for 32.5 hours per week. This includes lesson time, playtime, lunchtime etc.

This means that here at Woodstone, in order to comply with these regulations we need to do an extra 50 minutes per week i.e. 10 minutes per day.

This means that when the children come back on TUESDAY AUGUST 29th the formal start to the day will be 8:45am. Classroom doors will open at 8:40am.

For many children this won't be much of a change as they are already here ready to go into class at 8:45. However, as this is now when formal lessons will begin it is important ALL children are here ready for the earlier start.

The register will now be taken at 8:45am.

Please set your alarm clock a few minutes earlier, especially on that first Tuesday back!
