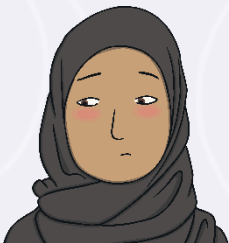

What Is Ramadan?

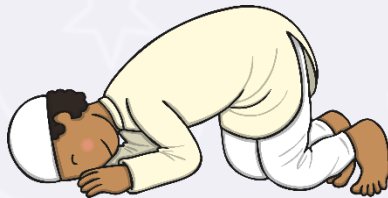
Ramadan is the ninth month of the lunar calendar.

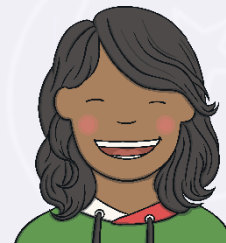

Eid al-Fitr means 'The Festival of Breaking of the Fast'.

Muslim people wear their best clothes and decorate their homes.

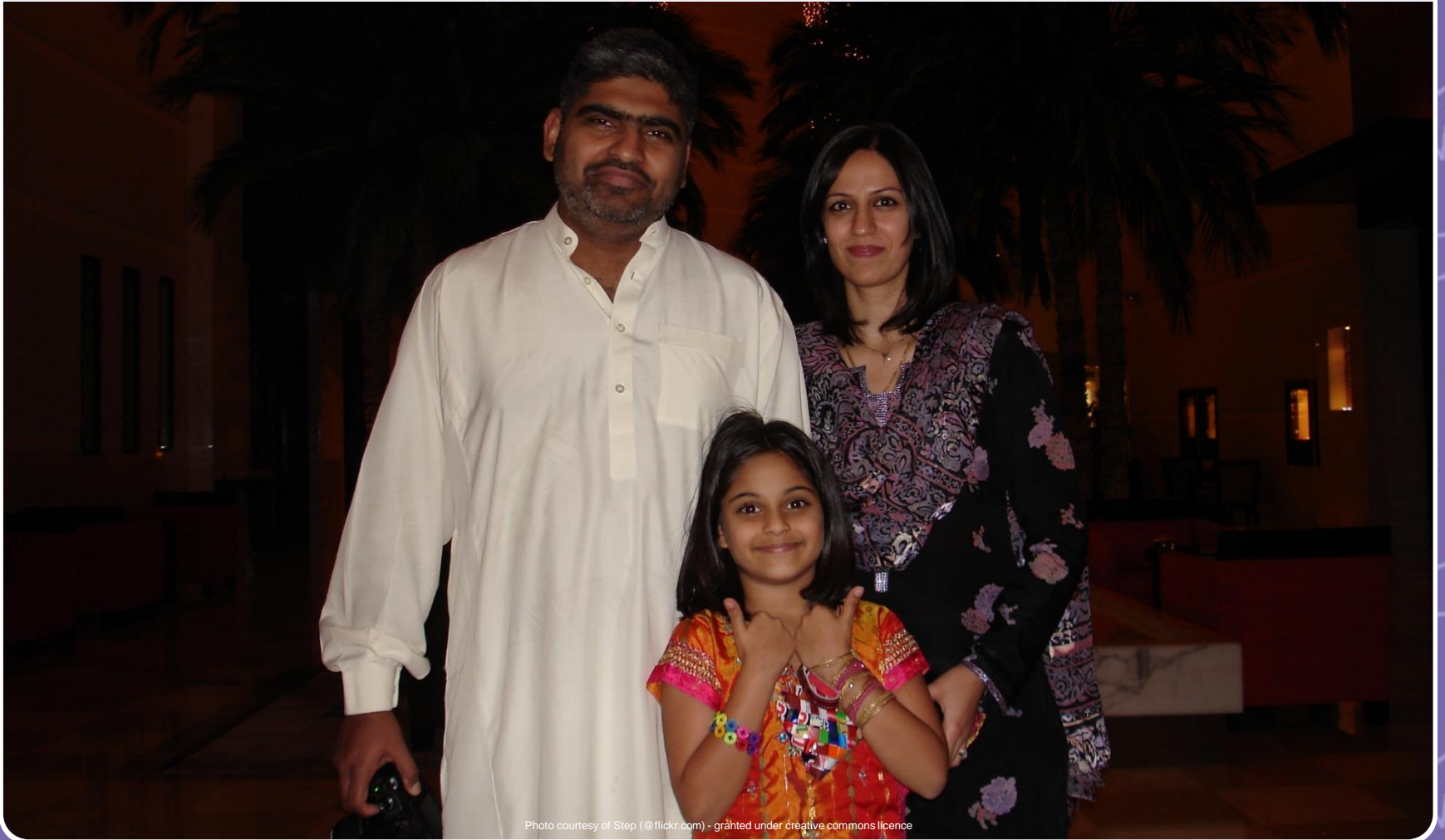

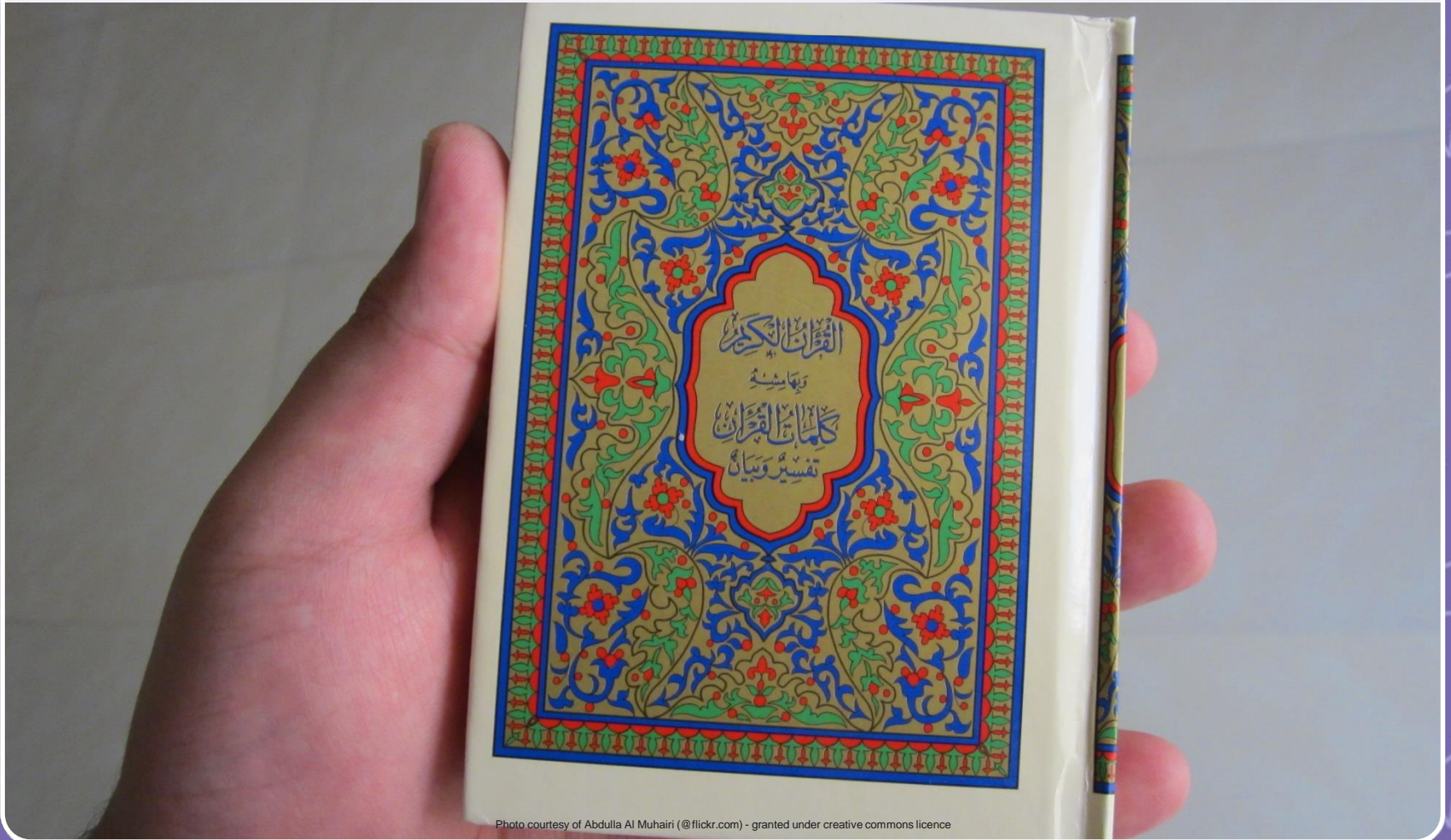

