

Parent's Handbook



Our Core Aims:

At Woody's we provide a safe, secure, relaxed yet stimulating environment, offering a range of activities to reflect the interests of the children in our care.

Introduction:

Woody's, our Wrap Around Care Club, is based at Woodstone Community Primary School. We provide care for children between the ages of 4-11 who attend our school.

The club is open during term time (excluding inset days) from:

- 7.30am until 8.45am
- 3:15pm until 6:00pm

Current costs for our sessions can be found in the "Payment of Fees" section of this handbook

Registration:

When an enquiry regarding places is made, parents or carers will be given all the relevant club information, including:

- Parent Handbook
- Registration Form
- Booking Form
- Medical Information Form
- Medicine Consent Form

The child will be able to attend the club as a soon as the completed forms are received.

Admission:

- Our Club is accessible to children attending Woodstone Community Primary School.
- All places are subject to availability
- We require a completed set of registration forms for your children before they can attend the club. This information will be treated as confidential and will be stored appropriately.
- We use a waiting list when the need arises. The waiting list will be operated on a first come, first served basis.

If no places are available the parent will be informed and the child's name added to the waiting list. As soon as suitable places become available parents will be informed.

Booking procedure:

- Parents must book a place for their child in advance using SchoolMoney on https://eduspot.co.uk/ or by using the SchoolMoney App.
- Last minute places can be booked on the actual day, providing there is space, by contacting the School Office.

Changes to days:

If you need to change the days that your child attends, please change your booking on SchoolMoney. This can be done up to the day before your booking requirement.

Temporary changes:

- We need to know if your child will not be attending the Club for any reason, please notify us as soon as possible.
- If your child doesn't attend a booked session, we will have to treat them as a 'missing child' unless you have notified us of their absence.
- If you know in advance of any days when your child will not be attending during the following week, please amend your booking on SchoolMoney.
- In cases of illness or emergency when notice cannot be given, please call as soon as you can.

Pricing Policy:

- Sessions required must be booked in advance via SchoolMoney on https://eduspot.co.uk/
- Payment at the time of booking is essential to enable us to adhere to staff:children ratios and for catering purposes.
- Any fees outstanding at the end of the month will be invoiced.
- Refunds are only given in the case of illness.

The following pricing structure applies:

The morning Club will run from 7:30am until 8:45am. The pricing structure for this is as follows:

7:30am – 8:45am
 7:45am – 8:45am
 8:15am – 8:45am
 £4 (includes breakfast) **
 £2 (does not include breakfast)

For example, a child coming to the breakfast club from 7:30am – 8:45am will pay £5 total. A child arriving at 7:40am will pay £5, but a child arriving at 7:45am will be charged £4.

- Children will not be admitted before 7:30am.
- ** Toast and cereal will be available with a drink as part of this price.
- Children arriving from 8:15am will pay £2 but will not be served breakfast.

The Club in the evening will run between 3:15pm and 6pm. The pricing structure for this is as follows.

3:15pm – 3:45pm
 3:15pm – 4:15pm
 3:15pm – 5:00pm
 3:15pm – 5:30pm
 48 (includes light tea)
 5:15pm – 6pm
 410 (includes light tea)
 412 (includes light tea)

Any time after 6pm £20

A drink and biscuit at 3:15pm and a light tea for children staying after 4:15pm will be available as part of this price.

If a child attends one of our own, teacher led in house after school clubs (e.g. netball) from 3:15pm until 4:15pm then the pricing structure will be as follows:

4:00pm – 5:00pm
 4:00pm – 5:30pm
 4:00pm – 6:00pm
 4:00pm – 6:00pm
 Any time after 6pm
 £5 (includes light tea)
 £8 (includes light tea)
 £20

Late payment of fees:

- Fees are reviewed annually by our Governing Body
- Any queries regarding fees should be directed to the Manager.
- If fees are not paid, the Governors will write to the parent or carer, requesting payment.
- If it is not possible to pay fees by the deadline then a meeting with the Headteacher is to be arranged as soon as possible.
- The Headteacher may issue a formal warning to the parent or carer informing them that continued late payment will result in their child's place at club being withdrawn. If the fees remain unpaid after all the above options have been explored, the club may cancel the child's place.

Fee structure:

Fees are charged as detailed. The club recognises that child care can be costly, so we encourage eligible parents or carers to claim the child care element of the Working Tax Credit. We are also registered to accept various childcare vouchers, please ask for more details.

- Fees are payable monthly in arrears.
- Fees are to be paid using SchoolMoney. Childcare vouchers are accepted.
- Fees are charged for booked sessions whether the child attends or not.
- We offer a 10% discount for siblings.

Staffing:

- Our club is staffed by the Manager and two assistants per session
- We aim to provide a smooth transition between school and club
- If you have a query or concern at any time, please speak to a member of staff at the club when you collect your child. If you prefer to arrange a more convenient time for a meeting, please contact the Manager.

Arrivals and departures:

- Admission is through the school's main entrance where you will be let in by a member of staff and departure is through the same door
- A register is taken when children arrive in our care. Parents will sign children in with the time they arrive and out with the time they are collected.
- We expect that your child will normally be collected by the people you have named on the
 registration form. If you need a different person to collect your child on a particular day, you
 must notify us in advance and provide the person collecting your child with the appropriate
 password.
- We will not release your child into the care of another person unknown to us without your authorisation.
- The evening Club finishes at 6pm, if you are delayed for any reason please telephone the Club to let us know. A contribution towards the costs for any extra staff wages will be incurred.
- If your child remains uncollected after 6.15pm and you have not warned us that you will be delayed and if we have been unable to reach you on any of your emergency contacts, we will follow our **Uncollected Children Policy** and contact the Social Care Team.

During Covid-19 restrictions, parents are not allowed in school. Children are to be admitted and collected at the hall door that leads onto the back playground. A member of Woody's staff will meet parents and sign the child in/out whilst parents are still in attendance.

Provision:

- The children are free to choose activities and resources as they wish.
- There will always be a selection of activities and resources available, including crafts, board games, construction, computer games, physical play, cookery, homework table, imaginative play and reading.
- We provide healthy snacks and light meals, including fresh fruit and vegetables.
- We promote independence, by encouraging the children to clear away after themselves wherever possible.
- We use fresh ingredients and follow statutory guidelines.
- Fresh drinking water is available at all times.
- We meet individual dietary requirements and parental preferences wherever possible.
- We recognise the importance of healthy nutrition for all children delivered in a calm, friendly setting.

Behaviour:

Woody's follows the school's behaviour policy. The club promotes an atmosphere of care, consideration and respect for everyone attending: children, staff and visitors.

We encourage appropriate behaviour through: praise for good behaviour; with emphasis on cooperative play, sharing, talking to children with the courtesy that we expect and engaging children in activities.

The club has procedures for dealing with unacceptable behaviour. We recognise that poor behaviour can occur from time to time for reasons that are not always evident, or as a result of special needs. We will try to be flexible in order to accommodate such cases. However, if you child is violent, or if their behaviour poses an immediate danger to themselves or others, we will require you to collect them from the club immediately. This will occur in only exceptional circumstances when other attempts at behaviour management have failed.

Behaviour (Adults):

We will not tolerate from any person, whether a parent, carer or visitor: bullying; aggressive, confrontational or threatening behaviour; or behaviour intended to result in conflict. Our club is a place of safety and security for the children who attend and the staff who work here, and we reserve the right to ban anyone exhibiting inappropriate behaviour from our premises.

Illness:

We are unable to care for children who are unwell. If your child becomes unwell whilst at the club we will contact you and ask you to make arrangements for them to be collected.

Please inform the Manager of any infectious illness your child contracts. If you child has had sickness or diarrhoea please do not send him or her to the club for 48 hours after illness has ceased.

Accidents and First Aid:

- Every precaution is taken to ensure the safety of the children at all times, and the club is fully insured.
- Our staff are trained in first aid and a first aid kit is kept on the premises.
- If your child has an accident whilst in our care, you will be informed when you collect your child.

Medication:

Please let a member of staff know if your child is taking prescribed medicine. If your child needs to take medicine whilst at the club you will need to complete a **Medicine Consent Form** in advance.

Child Protection:

We are committed to building a 'culture of safety' in which the children in our care are protected from abuse and harm. Any suspicion of abuse is promptly and appropriately responded to. We comply with local and national child protection procedures and ensure that all staff are trained appropriately. For more details see our **Child Protection Policy.**

The Club has clearly defined policies and procedures. Key points of the main policies are included in this handbook. Copies of our **Wrap Around Care Policy** are kept at the club and on the school website for parents to consult at all times.
